FACULTY HIKE

15 October

The Faculty of Social Studies would like to invite all FSS international students to join us on a hike around the Brno Lake to Veveří Castle. We plan to take the ferry boat back.

Students should plan to meet at the anchor at the bottom of the lake at 11:30. The hike to the castle is 8.5km and will take between 2.5-3 hours. Our halfway point will be at Veveří Castle. Do not be scared though - there is only a total of 200metres elevation! You can see the hike <u>here</u>.

Once arriving at the castle, we will have time for some food and drinks and to explore. You should pack water and snacks for the hike.

Entrance into the castle is 50czk, and the ferry back is between 55-110czk depending on your transportation card.

Meeting location: large Anchor at the lake (Trams 3 and 10 to Přístaviště) exact location.

Due to some scheduling changes, there will be no rain date.

CZECHOSLOVAK INDEPENDENCE DAY

October 28

Following the dissolution of Austrian-Hungaruan Empire many new states were established. On October 28, 1918, Czechs and Slovaks agreed to establish their state: Czechoslovakia. Today, the Czech Republic still celebrates this day, even though the country Czechoslovakia no longer exists. Flowers will be placed at Masaryk's statue in remembrance.

Similar to September 28, Statehood Day, stores larger than 200 square meters have to stay closed.

EKOFILM FESTIVAL

12-15 October

The EKOFILM dramaturgy team has selected the top 25 films in competition from a total of 243 entries. The festival jury will award the best films in the sections Beauty of Nature, Central European Films and Short Films. Any of the films in competition can then win one of the other awards - the Main Award of the Minister of the Environment for the best film and the President's Award of the Festival.

The final twenty-five entries will present the most films from Germany and the Czech Republic. These countries have four films in competition each. In addition, Germany will present one more documentary co-produced with Hungary. Two films were made in Austria. The other eleven documentaries in competition come from the UK, Iran, Finland, Denmark, Switzerland, Italy, Poland, the Netherlands, Belgium, and one each from Chile and Canada.

The full programme can be found on the festivals <u>website</u>. The language of the events is listed clearly, often discussions will be held in Czech (such as the opening discussion), however many of the films are in English or with English subtitles. Additionally, there are concerts throughout the week, and since music is international, we invite you to join in on the fun!

GRADUATING THIS SEMESTER?

what not to forget...

There are numerous deadlines in your final semester that you must meet if you want to graduate, and they are different for each programme. Here are a few examples of things you should make sure you know when (and how) to do - and if you don't know as your programme guarantor!

- submit thesis topic
- submit thesis draft
- submit final thesis (generally 1 month before defense)
- file intent to submit thesis
- file intent to take state exam
