
Internships (traineeships) related to area of study

Eligibility for Going Abroad

General

- Active student at FSS at time of departure
- At time of departure: BA students must be minimally in 2nd year

Unless articulated by host program/university are eligible

- BA, MA, or PhD students at MU
- full time or part time studies


Language

Traineeships abroad









Erasmus+ Traineeship

Destination

- 27 EU Member States + six other countries
- Placements are based on an agreement between the student, the organization, and the students academic coordinator

Period

Length of stay 2-12 months (the stays closer to the lower limit are preferred)

Financial Support

- 630, 750 EUR per month
- Scholarship is awarded by CZS, contact: Gabriela Složilová
- Students may need to pay for their MUNI tuition while abroad

Application Deadlines

- Applications are open in January, April, June and October <u>Students apply via ISOIS</u>
- Closest deadline: 31. October, 31. January



Application considerations

- Make sure you meet the minimum requirements (language level, courses, study level)
- Think about your goals are there enough courses to interest you (for at least 20 ECTS), will you want to live in this location for 5 months, do you want to connect your thesis to your time abroad, etc.



Key take a ways

- If you want to go abroad during the 2024-2025 year, especially outside the EU, start looking into the process now. (Dec. 15 deadlines)
- Visas be aware of your Czech visa status, make sure you can return to finish your degree
- Students should not go to their home (or permanent residence country) if you
 do so, you will receive no funding and your application will be given lowest
 priority.
